Our Community

North West Surrey Synagogue (NWSS) is a warm, inclusive, and dynamic Jewish community, committed to being *m'vakshay ha'derech* - seekers of the way. We are a **thriving, caring, and inclusive** Reform community, engaged in Jewish learning, meaningful practice, and social responsibility.

We celebrate and explore Jewish identity in **religious**, **cultural**, **educational**, **and social** ways. Our next Rabbi will be at the heart of this, helping members **find Jewish meaning in their daily lives** and creating a Synagogue that is **a living space**, **not just a building**. They will support members across all life stages, **fostering deep relationships and shared Jewish experiences**, **both inside and outside the shul walls**.

Job Description

Key Responsibilities:

1. Spiritual Leadership & Worship:

- 1.1. Lead engaging, meaningful services that honour NWSS' traditions while incorporating innovation, such as music, interactive elements, and opportunities for participation.
- 1.2. Support lay leaders in service leadership, **enabling a diversity of voices** to lead communal prayer and **continuing to grow** lay participation.
- 1.3. Ensure that **celebration**, **not just observance**, **is at the heart of festivals**, creating excitement and anticipation around Jewish ritual life.

2. Pastoral Care & Community Support:

- 2.1. Provide **compassionate**, **proactive pastoral support**, particularly for those facing illness, bereavement, or personal crises.
- 2.2. Build relationships beyond formal settings, **creating safe spaces where members** feel supported in times of both joy and sorrow.
- 2.3. Establish clear and transparent processes for pastoral care, ensuring **confidentiality** and appropriate communal support.
- 2.4. In accordance with Synagogue policies, **uphold the safeguarding of children, young people, and vulnerable adults**.

3. Education & Lifelong Learning:

- 3.1. Together with our Head of Cheder (*Nitzanim*), play a **central role in Cheder and B'nei Mitzvah preparation**, ensuring children and families remain engaged beyond milestone events.
- 3.2. Deliver innovative **adult education** programmes, supporting diverse learning styles including formal, informal, self-study, and modern *hevruta* (paired learning).
- 3.3. Foster a **culture of curiosity and deep thinking**, ensuring that members see Judaism as relevant to contemporary life.

4. Lifecycle Events:

- 4.1. Officiate at weddings, baby blessings, funerals, B'nei Mitzvah and other significant moments with sensitivity, making each event meaningful and personal.
- 4.2. Ensure that lifecycle events **connect people to the community beyond a single occasion**.

5. Community Building & Engagement:

- 5.1. Foster **intergenerational connections**, ensuring NWSS remains a welcoming and diverse space.
- 5.2. Reach out to families and individuals who may not attend services regularly, creating multiple access points into Synagogue life.
- 5.3. Support **new and evolving communal experiences beyond the Synagogue walls**, such as *Tashlich*, *Tu B'Shvat*, and *Shabbat* gatherings in homes.

6. Ethical & Inclusive Leadership:

- 7. Embody the **values of Progressive Judaism**, advocating for inclusivity and celebrating different Jewish identities.
 - 7.1. **Create 'brave spaces'** where members can engage in difficult conversations constructively and with empathy.
 - 7.2. Ensure that **marginal and underrepresented voices are heard** within the community.

8. Social Action & Wider Engagement

- 8.1. Help **bring social action to life**, making it an integral part of 'Living Judaism' rather than an activity undertaken by a few individuals.
- 8.2. Support and encourage **community-wide participation** in interfaith and social justice initiatives, while ensuring that these do not detract from core Synagogue responsibilities.
